### Session Goals

The UN Member States have stressed the need for the High Level Political Forum (HLPF) to promote transparency and implementation of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), by further enhancing the consultative role and participation of the Major Groups and other Stakeholders (MGoS) at the international level. The MGoS include non-governmental and non-profit organisations, business and industry, local authorities, among others, whose expertise contribute to policy formulation, planning, monitoring and evaluation, and therefore to the fulfilment of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. In accordance with General Assembly Resolution 67/290, while retaining the intergovernmental nature of discussions, the MGoS and other entities are invited to take part of the HLPF as observers, building on arrangements and practices observed by the Commission on Sustainable Development.

MGoS play a key role opening communication channels on the process of monitoring the implementation of Agenda 2030, allowing a diversity of groups and stakeholders to raise their voices and make recommendations. During the last years, the MGoS have evolved in more inclusive spaces, working with different thematics, promoting regional engagement, and articulating efforts with existing actors and platforms at the regional and local level. With diverse structures, the MGOs have adopted different procedures for their member's engagement and participation, being an important space for civil society participation in the 2030 Agenda review process.

The goal of the session is to share information regarding the MGoS' structure, functions, processes and discuss how to engage with the global monitoring process of the 2030 Agenda.
